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Edmark...the "one that works"!

What is the major educational need this grant addresses? Please give grade level and academic area.

Reading is at the core of learning. Without efficient reading skills, a student's ability to learn is greatly hindered across the curriculum. Widely regarded as the "one that works," the *Edmark Reading Program* has long helped students who need an alternative to phonics. It is often a challenge for students with special needs to read at an independent level and with good comprehension. The *Edmark Reading Program* focuses on vocabulary, comprehension, and fluency, using techniques that are supported by scientifically based reading research. It is ideal for use with students who have failed at learning phonemic awareness and phonics or who cannot master these skills.

The *Edmark Reading Program* is recommended for students with developmental disabilities, autism, students with learning disabilities, Title 1 students, ESL students, preschool and kindergarten students who lack vocabulary development, and non-readers who struggle with phonics. We are asking for funding to implement this program for our pre-k - 1st grade special needs students.

Approximately how many pupils will be affected by this project, both directly and indirectly?

The grant will directly impact all students at Reed Elementary (approx. 500) with a focus on those with special needs. The program is non-consumable, therefore it will continue to reach students every year. It will indirectly impact every student in our district by potentially raising our test scores and improving our grades on our district and school site report cards.

We all know that if we struggle to read something because we are having a hard time reading the words, then we don't understand it. Think about if you were reading a medical journal or something completely out of your comfort zone. You would come across words that you didn't know, then you would have to stop, sound it out, use context clues, or simply let it process until you have figured it out. Often times when this happens to us, we have to go back and reread the sentence maybe a couple of times before we understand what it is saying. Now imagine if you had to sound out or reread every word or at least most of them. Most of our struggling readers do the latter. They have to constantly sound out words and are not at all fluent at their current grade level. These students are basically going to be lucky to pass their achievement tests and with the testing trends now and the "high-stakes" that go along with it, we desperately need to do something to give these kids the upper hand. We believe we have found a program that will help us do this.

What the Edmark Reading Program is...

The Edmark Reading Program teaches students how to read. The print version can be used independently or in combination with the Edmark Reading Program: Level 1, Software. The key to this success is the program's use of a carefully sequenced, highly repetitive word recognition method combined with errorless learning. This approach eliminates incorrect responses and helps students view themselves as readers. It meets the requirements of No Child Left Behind (NCLB) with lessons in vocabulary, comprehension, and fluency. Some of the research-based instructional strategies include errorless learning, positive reinforcement, use of manipulatives, oral and sight word
