1. What is the major educational need this grant addresses? Please give grade level and academic area.

Following the Oklahoma State Department of Education Pre-Kindergarten guidelines (PASS), our classrooms provide a literacy-rich environment, as well as math practice through learning centers, or learning areas. Our classrooms provide ten to twelve different learning centers weekly. This arrangement allows for a wide range of developmental interests and abilities within the same classroom. The materials and methods included in this grant will also meet the Oklahoma Pre-K guidelines in the following areas: Creative Skills, Language Arts, Science

2. Approximately how many pupils will be affected by this project, both directly and indirectly?

There will be approximately sixty students directly affected by this project throughout the 2020-2021 school year. The materials are non-consumable, meaning this on-going project will affect an infinite number of students throughout the subsequent years. The materials in

this grant are developmentally appropriate children for 4 and 5 years of age, allowing all Pre-K children to participate, and experience success.

The material requested in this grant will be used on a daily basis as learning centers in our Pre-K classrooms. This grant includes hands-on activities that allow students to explore independently, with a partner or small group, or as a class during center time.
