Their will be approximately 100 or more students directly impacted in the school year of 2021-2022. The materials purchased are non-consumable. Students will not only have access to materials in the classroom, but also during Walk-To-Read, After School Tutoring Program, Summer School and Targeted Intervention Programs.
